In reading we will access both aspirational texts through whole class teaching, as well as texts matched individually to the child's level. Children will have a range of reading experiences as a balanced reader.

Courage and Legacy

During this theme we will be exploring the concepts of Courage and Legacy through the development our history, geography and art skills.

We will communicate historically using appropriate historical vocabulary. We will also develop drawing skills in the form of perspective drawing.



How will you assess my child's reading?

Guided Reading takes place weekly in Year 6.

Your child will read in a group with an adult - a
text which is pitched 2 levels above that which is
sent home. In addition to this, children take
home a library book, which they then complete
an assessment for using the online Accelerated
Reader tool (AR). Individual assessments of
reading (running records) take place termly and
you can request feedback about these from your
child's teacher at parents evening.

When will we receive Home Learning?

In Year 6, Home Learning is set every Sunday and handed in the following Sunday. Home Learning will start from Sunday 15th September – details of the tasks will be shared on the Weebly under the 'Home Learning' tab each week. There is only ever one task recorded in Home Learning books each week, which will be outlined on the Weebly each Sunday.

In addition to Home Learning tasks, we will set spelling words to learn as part of our word study program. These will be sent home along with some strategies you can use to teach them. The children will also bring home their yellow Word Study book so that you can see how this is being taught in school.

What assessments will my child have?

In the week beginning 13th October, the children will sit our their JC entrance assessment. Further details will be sent closer to the time. At the end of the year, students will complete a Dubai wide compulsory assessment at the end of the academic year for Maths, English and Science, called Progress Tests. As parents, you will receive a detailed report of the outcomes of these assessments. As well as this, Year 6 students sit SATs which are the assessments based on the British National Curriculum. There will also be regular teacher assessment throughout the year through a variety of means.
